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## 1. APPLICATION ITEMS

## APPLICATION PERIOD

Spring Class (April enrollment) October 1 to November 10, Autumn Class (October enrollment) April 1, to May 10,

## REQUIREMENTS

Those who meet the following conditions can apply:

- 1. Those who have completed secondary school education in the home country or in a foreign country in the normal way.
- 2. One who can surely bear the tuition and living expenses necessary for studying in Japan, with a proof of asset formation documents such as a bankbook.
- 3. Those who have studied Japanese language for 150 hours or more and have Japanese proficiency level of at least N5.
- 4. Those who passed the "Preliminary Entrance Examination" conducted by our school.

The "Preliminary Entrance Examination" is conducted for students who wish to enter our school to ensure they meet the requirements for studying abroad in view of their economic, academic ability and adequacy.



Documents to be submitted vary by country. We will keep you updated on the latest information.

- A. Certificate of Bank Deposit Balance
- B. If a relative (father, mother, husband, or wife) pays the expenses,

- 2. Proof of deposit balance of expenses payer (for the past 3 years), income certificate, certificate of employment
  - 3. Proof of relatives (copy of family register, etc.)

\* The Japanese language school will apply for the application of the Certificate of Eligibility for obtaining International Student Visa according to the provisions of the Immigration Bureau of the Ministry of Justice. Please submit applications along with the admission screening fee.

## NOTIFICATION OF SCREENING RESULTS

Regarding the Preliminary Exam, we will notify the applicants at the propriate time after the exam.

Regarding the results of screening documents and application for status of residence, we plan to notify the applicants in late February for April students and in late August for October students.

## X Note on the tuition payment

- · Please make the payment of the second tuition fee before the beginning of the new term. We will inform you of the specific payment time.
- · As a general rule, payments that are already paid will not be returned for any reason.
- The tuition fee for the second year and thereafter can be paid in installments.

## **※** Payment method

Within one week after the Certificate of Eligibility is issued, please send the tuition and screening fees for the first year to the bank account designated by the school. Airport pickup and drop off from airport to dormitory, per person. \quantum 3,000

## 7. OTHERS

## (1) Part-Time Job

The Regional Immigration Bureau permits students to work part-time in Japan within 28 hours per week without disturbing your academic work. However, if you unlawfully work part-time beyond this scope, you may be instructed by the school, or in some cases, may be withdrawn from school or asked to return to your country.

## (2) National Health Insurance

All international students enrolled in our school will join this insurance. With this insurance, you will only need to pay 30% of medical expenses.

## (3) Dormitory

For the first 6 months after the school entrance, all students should use the school-designated dormitory and learn about Japanese lifestyle. 6 months later, those who wish to move out will be allowed to do so.

Note: Several dormitories are available in different locations.
